

JOB POSTING: Indigenous Nations Liaison

Busse for Montana, the gubernatorial campaign of Ryan Busse and Raph Graybill, is seeking a highly-motivated team player for the position of Indigenous Nations Liaison. Under the direction of the Political Director and Campaign Manager, the role of the Indigenous Nations Liaison will be to represent the campaign and work closely with Indigenous Nations and People throughout the state.

Specifically, the Indigenous Nations Liaison will work closely with and among Tribal governments and communities to ensure that Busse for Montana hears, understands, reflects and appropriately acts upon the values and voices of Indigenous People. Roles and responsibilities will include, but are not limited to, scheduling meetings with Indigenous governments, scheduling candidate participation in events and activities within Indigenous Communities, developing strategies for meaningful participation and outreach, and advising Busse for Montana on culturally appropriate ways to engage, empower, and represent Indigenous People. When elected governor, Ryan has committed to ensuring that state agencies and boards are meaningfully represented by Indigenous People, so the Liaison will also be tasked with identifying and working with those interested in serving in the Busse Administration.

While previous campaign and political experience is helpful, Busse for Montana is primarily looking for a knowledgeable, passionate representative who specializes in strong organizational, communication and networking skills. The ideal applicant thrives in a team environment while working proactively and independently.

This position may be a full-time position <u>or</u> a contracted position. It will require evening and weekend hours through the summer and fall of 2024. This position will require statewide travel, including to Indigenous Nations (costs of which will be covered by the campaign). Compensation will be commensurate with expertise and experience.
